DOSAGE AND INSTRUCTIONS

- Maintenance 1/4 tsp per gallon of water under tree's canopy monthly. Wait at least 24 hours before watering again.
- Stressed Trees 16 oz per 100 gallons of water (equivalent to 1 tsp per gallon).
- Transplanting 1 tsp per gallon of water before and after transplanting.

For strong, deep-set roots, **water deeply and thoroughly** - allowing the water to soak in and saturate deep into the soil. Wait until soil is thirsty before watering again.

Tree roots seek water. If they can't find it deep in the soil, they will grow sideways, reducing stability and possibly running into foundations and lifting sidewalks.

Tip: You may use a root injector at the perimeter of the canopy, but do NOT inject directly into trees.

MORE ABOUT TRANSPLANTING

- Spacing Be sure to space plants in consideration of their full mature size.
- 1 tsp per gallon of water before and after transplanting.
- Whether you have bare roots, root ball, or a nursery pot, soak it in SUPERthrive treated water for 30 minutes or until air bubbles cease.
- Burlap wrapped trees can be soaked and planted without removing the burlap, but be sure to cut off any wires.
- Dig a hole twice as wide as the roots, giving room for roots to grow.
- Preparing the hole: Mix fresh amendments with the soil that was removed. We recommend organic matter, vermiculite, beneficial bacteria, and mycorrhizae.
 Although peat moss was a favorite of gardeners for many years, it is a scarce resource and should not be overused.

 Remove your tree from the soak and loosen the soil to let roots breathe, then place your tree and its new home, covering the roots with soil. Press firmly but not too tightly, creating a valley around the tree to hold water.

Finish by watering with plenty of SUPERthrive treated

water.

Tip: For trees 15 gallons or larger, use the hole for soaking and follow the directions above.
